Activities and Update

- The Sustaining Committee agreed to revisit the industry initiative process to address other critical occupational shortages, as well as nursing.
- Bill Robertson will remain chair.
- Catherine Crowley, MHA, reported that the top five hospital job vacancy categories are nurse anesthetist 25.2%, respiratory therapist tech 22.5%, physical therapist 18.5%, nuclear medicine tech 14.0% and physician's assistant 13.5%.
- Teach for the Health of It funding of \$1.5 million is obligated. \$1 million in scholarship funding to increase nursing faculty obligated to 220 nursing students. \$500,000 obligated to 54 employers to train 1,250+ incumbent workers for healthcare occupations.
- Credentialing military healthcare personnel transitioning to the private sector remains a priority; collaborate with Bioscience and Aerospace initiatives.
- The "Guide to Healthcare Occupations in Maryland" for military personnel relocating to Maryland will continue to be available online.
- CAEL has 327 apprentices enrolled through Adventist HealthCare.
- Nina Roa, MSDE, presented an overview of the Health Professions Pathway Program to prepare students for postsecondary education in bioscience and healthcare.
